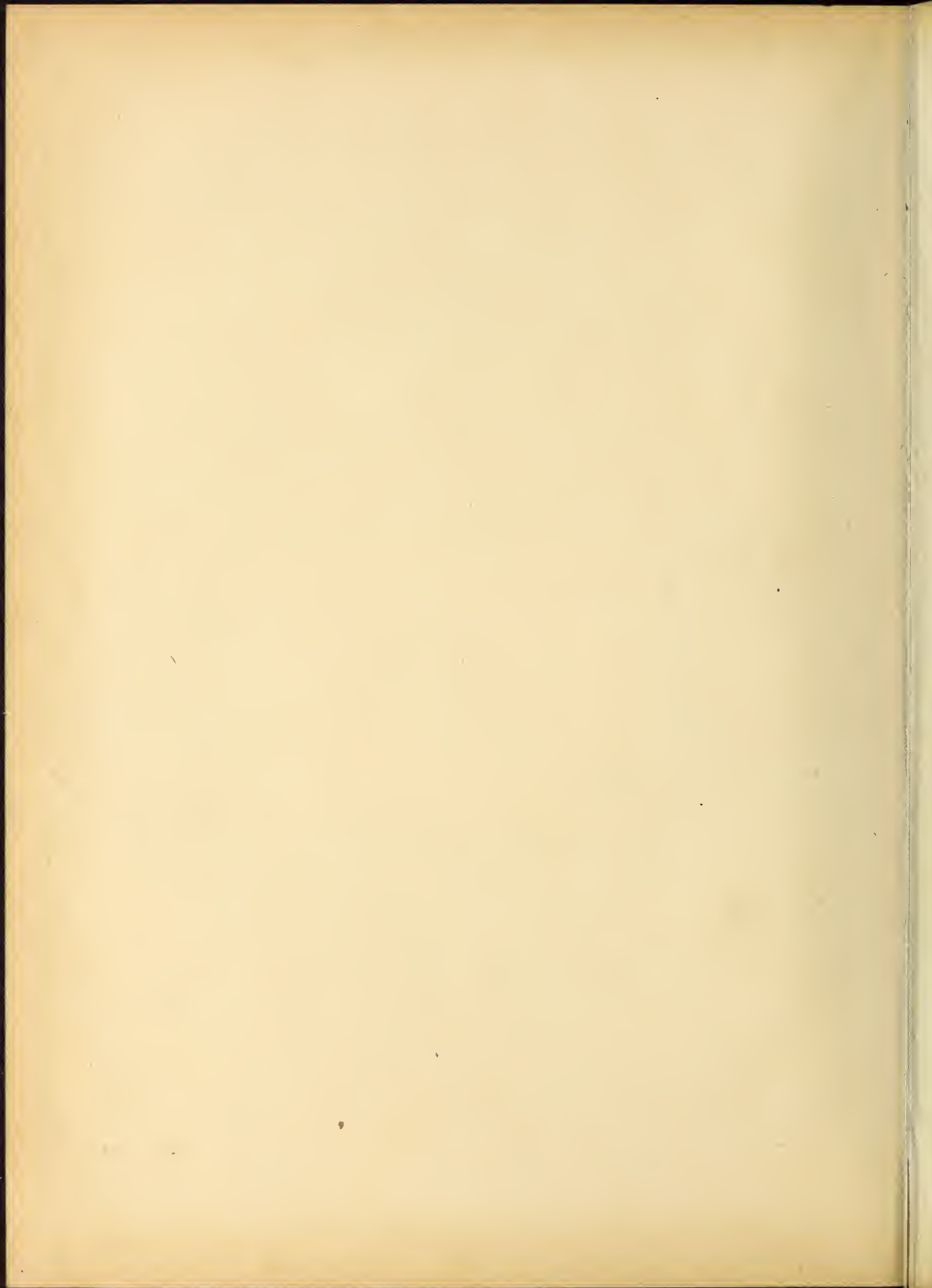

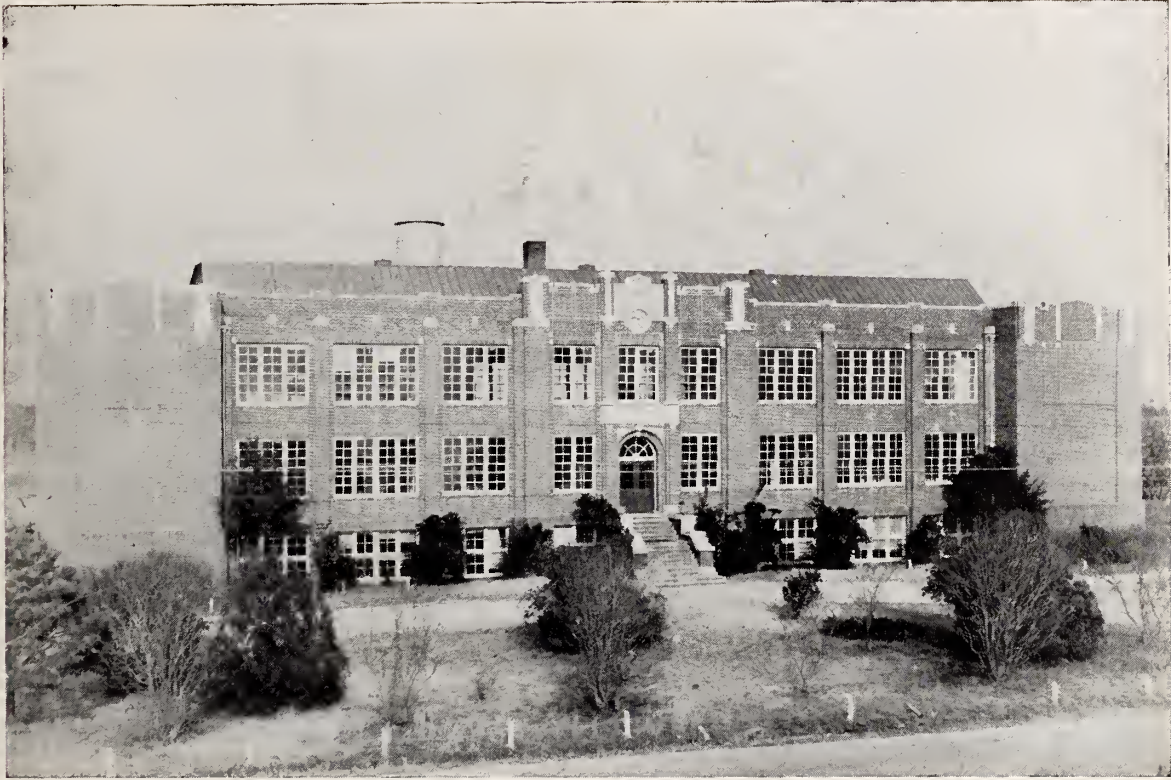
## FOREWORD
